BOOK SYNOPSIS

Just imagine what things would be like if EVERYBODY did all the things we are told not to do! This book (in black and white pictures) shows exactly what it would be like---but then the last few pages show what it would be like if each person did what we should do! This books shows the importance of personal responsibility for following rules.

LESSON OBJECTIVE

Following rules keeps us safe and helps us keep things organized. Our school is a better place when we take personal responsibility for following rules and following instructions.

LESSON MATERIALS AND ADVANCED PREPARATION

Materials: eraser & chalk or dry markers to play tic-tac-toe; list of questions numbered 1 through 9 (see handout)

Preparation: Cut out the numbered questions and place these in 9 envelopes with the number on the outside of the envelope to match the number of the question. This will keep your questions organized. Prepare the multiple questions to allow you to play several games of tic-tac-toe (as time permits).

KEY VOCABULARY AND CONCEPTS

Smudge - smearing or spreading messy handprints when we touch windows or walls with our dirty hands

Hash - mushy food that is made up of finely chopped potatoes with some meat and spices

Bud - blossom part of the flower

PRE-READING DISCUSSION

Show the front cover of the book.

Say the title and have the students repeat "<u>if everybody did</u>." This book helps us see what things would be like if everybody did not keep simple rules. When we come in our school and see our clean floors and our organized classrooms....we might wonder, what if everyone came to school with muddy shoes and what if everyone threw things on the floor instead of putting things away or in the garbage can? Our school would not look like it does right now. In big letters, write "If Everybody Did" on the chalk board.

READ THE BOOK

Each time the book says "if everybody did," point to the board and ask the students to say "if everybody did" with you.

POST READING DISCUSSION

Ask the students what school would be like if no one followed the teacher's instructions. Ask the students what it might be like if all the adults in the world did not follow directions on the roads, such as stopping at the stop lights, driving on the right side of the road, and wearing seatbelts.

Ask the following questions:

- What rules or instructions are important to follow in school? Why?
- What rules or instructions are important for grownups to follow? Why?

POST READING ACTIVITY

Tic-Tac-Toe Activity

- Draw a large tic tac toe grid on the chalkboard (9 spaces)
- Divide the class into 2 groups (X and O)
- Choose a person from the X group to select a number 1 through 9.
- Choose a numbered paper to match the student's choice. Each paper has a question.
 Read the question out loud and have the student answer the question prior to marking the X, or O in the selected number's spot.
- Continue playing until a team wins the tic-tac-toe game.
- If time permits, play more games of tic-tac-toe.

CLOSURE

Hang the poster (provided) in the room and remind the students of how important it is to follow rules and directions.
