START

Focus on Relationships ← - L

Affirmation. Work to build a school climate where interpersonal relationships take center stage. This can be done by avoiding exclusion and labels that place the blame on children,

families or others.

School leaders should give feedback to teams regularly, waiting for review meetings to highlight issues only draws out and intensifies problems.



Build a Culture of Respect and Understanding

Share perspectives. When debriefing about the conflict or behavior, demonstrate respect for different views (remember that perception is reality for many kids). Model

how to have a conversation respectfully.

Help establishing belonging. It has been said that all each of us has ever wanted was a) Belonging and b) Success. Any discipline and/or consequence we provide should never put those two goals at risk.



Restiution



Agree on how to set things right. Working towards conflict resolution and working to repair whatever was damaged is crucial in this form of discipline. Most of the time, we should be looking for the time and the effort it will take to restore what was damaged. Historically, too much time has been spent on drafting various ways to punish kids.

Multi-Tiered Systems of Support



Intel. Work on a system of restorative practices and provide building leadership with regular feedback. The loop only works if the feedback from teachers and

students loops through leadership and back again to students and teachers.
